



## Engineer Officer of the Watch Unlimited CoC (Exam Route) For Previously Shore Trained Engineers, Engineering Graduates and Ex-Royal Navy Personnel

### Intended For

Those with previous engineering experience and qualifications, i.e. candidates who have followed a recognised modern apprenticeship or other scheme involving 3 years craft training, engineering graduates qualified to at least HND level, and ex-Royal Navy engineering personnel, wishing to attain a certificate of competency as Engineer Officer of the Watch for vessels of unlimited power in the unlimited area. The previous training, qualifications, and experience completed by candidates must be approved by the MCA for entry

### Entry Requirements

Medically fit holding an ENG1 certificate. Letter of Initial Assessment from the MCA accepting the candidate's previous training, qualifications, and experience, and specifying any additional or varied requirements such as workshop skills training and reduced or extra sea service.

### Duration

Up to 1 year.

### Content

Study pack. Personal Survival Techniques, Fire Prevention & Firefighting, Elementary First Aid, and Personal Safety & Social Responsibilities basic safety short courses, and Advanced Firefighting, Proficiency In Survival Craft & Rescue Boats, and Medical First Aid advanced safety short courses. Completion of training record book on board ship. Additional workshop skills training as may be specified for individual candidates by the MCA. Preparation for two IAMI written exams in General Engineering Knowledge, and Motor Engineering Knowledge, and MCA oral exam.





## Structure

Basic safety training courses of about 1 weeks duration. Introduction to study pack and training record book. 6 months sea service on vessels over 350kW which must be verified by appropriate watchkeeping certificates and testimonials, as specified by the MCA. Advanced safety courses and exam preparation of about 4 weeks duration. Any additional workshop skills training required.

## Funding

For seafarers not sponsored or employed by a shipping company MCA SMarT funding may be available for payment direct to the seafarer.

## Qualifications

IAMI exams, plus Short Courses, and a MCA STCW '95 Reg. III/1 CoC as Engineer Officer of the Watch.

## Career Progression

A MCA STCW '95 Reg. III/3 CoC as Second Engineer Under 3,000kW Near Coastal Area, or Reg. III/3 CoC as Second Engineer Under 3,000kW Unlimited Area and Reg. III/2 as Second Engineer Under 6,000kW Near Coastal Area, or Reg. III/2 CoC as Second Engineer Unlimited, and further progression through the certificate structure.
