



Marine Engine Operator Licence (Workshop Training Route)

Intended For

Engine Room Ratings and Deck Personnel wishing to attain a Marine Engine Operator Licence to sail as Second Engineer on vessels under 750kW in the unlimited area.

Entry Requirements

Medically fit holding an ENG1 certificate. 24 months sea service on ships over 200kW, or 2 years shore employment with an engineering background acceptable to the MCA and 3 months qualifying sea service as a trainee marine engine operator on ships over 200kW. Sea service and training may be completed in either a dedicated engineering or dual deck and engineering capacity, and must be verified by appropriate watchkeeping certificates and testimonials, as specified by the MCA. A MCA Notice of Eligibility.

Duration

3 months.

Content

Workshop skills training. Personal Survival Techniques, Fire Prevention & Firefighting, Elementary First Aid, Personal Safety & Social Responsibilities, Advanced Firefighting, Proficiency In Survival Craft & Rescue Boats, and Medical First Aid short courses (unless any course or its previous equivalent has already been completed). Preparation for MCA oral exam.

Structure

Full time training at SSNS.





Career Progression

A Senior Marine Operator Licence for Chief Engineers on Vessels Under 750kW in the Near Coastal Area, or a MCA STCW '95 Reg. III/1 CoC as Engineer Officer of the Watch Unlimited, and further progression through the certificate structure.

Funding

For seafarers not sponsored or employed by a shipping company MCA SMarT funding may be available for payment direct to the seafarer.

Qualifications

MNTB Workshop Skills Training certificate, plus Short Courses, and a Marine Engine Operator Licence for Second Engineers on Vessels Under 750kW in the Unlimited Area.
